A note from Mr. Sabatino,





Dear Parents/Guardians:

Due to all the hard work from all of our children and staff last year our school is rated a B!! We will be continuing with all of these efforts to keep growing academically. We opened the school year, in an exciting way this year with our first every Parent Pep Rally to help continue to build our new House System and to get the children and parents more involved. All of our new students and Kindergarteners were sorted into houses with our new wheel. In addition to the House sorting, we began having all the students take their first FAST and iReady assessments. These assessments give us a benchmark for where they are academically beginning their grade. We can also see if they had any summer loss. We are also having a friendly competition for the class at each grade level with the highest percentage of student who work on iReady for the 45 minutes each week and receive a mastery percentage of 70% or higher.

Our car line in both the morning and the afternoon needs your attention. School begins at 8:00 sharp so please make sure your children are here before then so they are ready to begin their studies. Also, dismissal starts at 2:05 so please be here earlier or at least by then to pick up your child. This will help greatly with the speed of the line. Please remember that when merging in the car lines we need to be nice and allow one car at a time to merge. Also, having your children ready to exit the car in the morning on the passenger side would help to greatly speed up the drop-off. Our fantastic PTO who purchased the dismissal program call CurbSmart that we use. This system uses the placards given out with the numbers on them to call your child from their class to the pick-up line. Having the placard hanging in your front window with the number facing out helps us to input the number. Pease remember to be considerate to our neighbors and do not park on their property or in our bus loop. If you come through the car line and always pull up as far as you can, the line will move quickly and the children will be safely loaded into your cars.

As always, we are looking to increase our parent involvement so our School Advisory Council (SAC) and PTO meetings will be held in the mornings so you can come to the meeting prior to dropping your child(ren) off at school. The meetings are the third Wednesday of each month starting at 7:00 am in the Media Center. Please make every effort you can to attend these meetings so your input can be heard and acted on. You can become more active in your child's education by attending these meetings and the other school functions. Thank you in advance for all your support and we look forward to working with your children.

Understanding Your Student's i-Ready Diagnostic Results

What is the i-Ready Diagnostic?

The i-Ready Diagnostic is an adaptive assessment that adjusts its questions for each student. As a student answers correctly, the questions get more difficult. As a student answers incorrectly, the questions get easier. This adaptability allows the i-Ready Diagnostic to identify the strengths and opportunities for growth of each student.

Why is my student taking it?

The purpose of the i-Ready Diagnostic is not to give your student a grade but instead to determine how best to support their learning. It will help your student's teacher(s) determine their needs, personalize their learning, and monitor progress throughout the year.

What if my student is performing below grade level?

This situation can happen, and teachers and schools have many strategies and programs to help accelerate your student's learning. Having this information can help you, your student, and their teachers have the right conversations to make the needed progress.

What can I do to help my student?

- Discuss these results with your student. Celebrate their strengths and progress, and collaborate with them on planning how they will reach their goals.
- Reach out to your student's teacher to get more ideas and resources to support your student in specific domains and/or skills.
- If your student uses i-Ready Personalized Instruction, review their progress on the student dashboard and support their learning at home with these tips



To all of our new and returning families, ¡Bienvenidos! Welcome! Byenveni!


We are very excited and looking forward to working with your children this year :)

Kindergarten:


The Fabulous kindergarten teachers are excited about the new school year and watching our children SOAR. We have been reviewing our procedures and rules. Ask your child about their classroom's social contract and our promise to each other to always due our Personal Best while at school. Please review all papers that come home in the communication folder daily. Don't forget to sign the communication log nightly and send it back with your child. Remember to read with your child every day! We look forward to reviewing our curriculum and our daily routine at Open House/ Curriculum Night on September 4th from 6– 7:30 p.m.



Hello first grade families. The first weeks of schools have flown by. We love getting to know your child each and every day! Our DEAL lessons (Drop Everything And Lead) have been very meaningful, so please make sure your child arrives on time for school every day! In ELA, we will be in Unit 1: Plants and Animals Grow and Change. At home, your child should find a cozy spot and read for 20 minutes every day. In science, we will be discovering what science is by using our senses to observe and describe objects. In social studies, we will be learning about American history/chronological order. At home, discuss the sequence of things you do (first, second, third, etc...). In math, students will gain a deeper understanding of 2 and 3 dimensional shapes . At home, play math word puzzle games (make figures using shapes, create a picture using a variety of shapes learned.). If you have any questions or concerns, please don't hesitate to contact us. Hello Third Grade Families! August marked a wonderful return to school! We celebrated our students as they reconnected with friends and jumped back into learning.




