# CASEL's Updated Framework



SELF-AWARENESS: The abilities to understand one's own emotions, thoughts, and values and how they influence behavior across contexts. This includes capacities to recognize one's strengths and limitations with a well-grounded sense of confidence and purpose. Such as:

- · Integrating personal and social identities
- Identifying personal, cultural, and linguistic assets
- Identifying one's emotions
- Demonstrating honesty and integrity
- Linking feelings, values, and thoughts
- · Examining prejudices and biases
- Experiencing self-efficacy
- · Having a growth mindset
- Developing interests and a sense of purpose

SOCIAL AWARENESS: The abilities to understand the perspectives of and empathize with others, including those from diverse backgrounds, cultures, & contexts.

This includes the capacities to feel compassion for others, understand broader historical and social norms for behavior in different settings, and recognize family, school, and community resources and supports. Such as:

- · Taking others' perspectives
- Recognizing strengths in others
- Demonstrating empathy and compassion
- · Showing concern for the feelings of others
- Understanding and expressing gratitude
- Identifying diverse social norms, including unjust ones
- Recognizing situational demands and opportunities
- Understanding the influences of organizations/systems on behavior

SELF-MANAGEMENT: The abilities to manage one's emotions, thoughts, and behaviors effectively in different situations and to achieve goals and aspirations. This includes the capacities to delay gratification, manage stress, and feel motivation & agency to accomplish personal/collective goals. Such as:

- Managing one's emotions
- Identifying and using stress-management strategies
- Exhibiting self-discipline and self-motivation
- · Setting personal and collective goals
- Using planning and organizational skills
- Showing the courage to take initiative
- Demonstrating personal and collective agency

RELATIONSHIP SKILLS: The abilities to establish and maintain healthy and supportive relationships and to effectively navigate settings with diverse individuals and groups. This includes the capacities to communicate clearly, listen actively, cooperate, work collaboratively to problem solve and negotiate conflict constructively, navigate settings with differing social and cultural demands and opportunities, provide leadership, and seek or offer help when needed. Such as:

- Communicating effectively
- Developing positive relationships
- · Demonstrating cultural competency
- Practicing teamwork and collaborative problem-solving
- · Resolving conflicts constructively
- Resisting negative social pressure
- Showing leadership in groups
- · Seeking or offering support and help when needed
- · Standing up for the rights of others

RESPONSIBLE DECISION-MAKING: The abilities to make caring and constructive choices about personal behavior and social interactions across diverse situations. This includes the capacities to consider ethical standards and safety concerns, and to evaluate the benefits and consequences of various actions for personal, social, and collective well-being. Such as:

- . Demonstrating curiosity and open-mindedness
- · Identifying solutions for personal and social problems
- Learning to make a reasoned judgment after analyzing information, data, facts
- Anticipating and evaluating the consequences of one's actions
- Recognizing how critical thinking skills are useful both inside & outside of school
- Reflecting on one's role to promote personal, family, and community well-being
  - Evaluating personal, interpersonal, community, and institutional impacts

# Palm Beach County's SEL Updated Definition...



Social and emotional learning (SEL) leads to children, youth and adults achieving academic, post-secondary, career, and life success. SEL involves acquiring and effectively applying knowledge, attitudes and skills to develop healthy identities, manage emotions and achieve personal and collective goals, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain supportive relationships, make responsible and caring decisions, and demonstrate behaviors that contribute to academic success.

Our mission is to foster the growth, development and educational achievement of all students by prompting wellness and health in a safe and friendly environment. The School Health Program is a partnership between The School District of Palm Beach County, the Health Care District Palm Beach County, and the Florida Department of Health Palm Beach County. Health care and services are provided to more than 180,000 students in the District.



# SCHOOL HEALTH SERVICES PROGRAM MANAGEMENT

#### **Support Services – Health Services**





### Additional Support Provided to Palm Beach County Schools during Pandemic

- Formation of Physical Actions of Physical Acti
- ❖ To avoid delay in student registration, Immunization records for students registering from out-of-state/country were transferred onto the required FL Immunization Certificate form DH 680 by the immunization team and were sent to the school's data processor.
- ❖ To ensure compliance in state reporting, the team searched for and entered immunization data into the Student Information System (SIS) for kindergarten and seventh grade students, in time for the state's annual report.
- ❖ To support schools with missing/expired immunization records, the team searched the FL SHOTS database for missing records and sent them to the schools.
- To support data processors and school nurses, the team serves as a resource to verify that health forms are accurate and in compliance for school attendance.
