Semester Exam Bell Schedules and Procedures

Our semester exams will begin on Tuesday, May 27th and run through Friday, May 30th, which is the last school day of the semester and school year. The school day on May 27th will begin and end at the normal times, with a slightly modified bell schedule to accommodate students taking their period 6 exam. However, May 28th, 29th, and 30th will be modified, "early-release" exam days: school will begin at 8:30 am and end at 12:40 pm (please see the schedule below).

Important Exam Information

Semester Exam Early Dismissal Day School Bus Transportation

On May 28th, 29th, and 30th, school buses will run at their usual morning times; however, in the afternoon, buses will depart from Dreyfoos at approximately 12:55 pm to begin drop-offs. As on any other school day, students may only ride the bus they have registered for via the District's Register Your Ride portal.

Semester Exam Early Dismissal Day Tri Rail Transportation

On May 28th, 29th, and 30th, students who ride the Tri Rail will ride the usual P608 morning train that is scheduled to arrive at the West Palm Beach station at 8:00 am. In the afternoon, students should ride the P625 train that departs from the West Palm Beach station at 12:56 pm.

Semester Exam Early Dismissal Days: Students with Extended Time

Each scheduled exam block is 2 hours. However, different teachers' exams may be different lengths of time, up to 2 hours. Therefore, students with extended time may or may not finish an exam within the regularly scheduled exam block. If a student does not finish an exam within the scheduled block and still has time remaining, that student will proceed to their next exam, following the day's exam schedule, and then go to the Media Center immediately after school (12:40 pm) to continue any unfinished exams from that day.

If a student needs to stay after 12:40 pm to finish an exam(s) and needs assistance arranging transportation home from school or an accommodation to this schedule, please see Mr. Dawson or Mr. Lewis. School buses will depart from Dreyfoos at approximately 12:55 pm on early-release exam days.

Example:

On Tuesday, May 28th, a student with extended time does not finish their period 1 exam within the scheduled 8:30 – 10:30 am exam block. That student will proceed to take their period 2 exam during the regularly scheduled 10:40 am – 12:40 pm block. When the school day ends at 12:40 pm, that student will go to the Media Center to continue and finish their period 1 exam, using the time they have remaining. They would also use this time to finish their period 2 exam, if they did not finish it during the exam block.




Jazz Ensemble Earns National Recognition at Essentially Ellington


- 3rd Place, News Story: Jefferson Jubilee Gift Wrap by Carolina Ricci, Morgan Bertisch, and Gionna Odell




Jackson Murray Named Bank of America Student Leader

DSOA Slam Poetry Team Wins State Championship





It's that time of the year again to get excited for Dreyfoos Athletics for the next school year. Fall sports are approaching as a couple of our programs start as early as August 4th, which is the beginning of pre-school week for teachers.
