



### Why the House System?



- ❖ Fosters a **culture of belonging** because houses are composed of **every student** and **staff member in the school** allowing students to socialize with one another across grades and with positive adult role models beyond just their classroom teachers.

## Parent Pick-Up and Drop-Off

#### **Aquarius Gate:**

- Is not a designated drop-off or pick-up area.
- Only students who live in the designated area will receive an Aquarius ID and be allowed to enter and exit through this gate.

#### **Lyons Road:**

- The entrance to the car-line is at 5200 Lyons Road.
- All students should be dropped-off and picked-up in the car-line.
- Upon entering the car-line students should be ready to depart their vehicle when they arrive at the front of the school.
- Drivers are to be hands-free and refrain from using their Cell Phones while in the car-line to ensure the safety of our students and staff.
- We ask that you continuously move all the way to the front of the car-line following the orange cones.
- Students are not to be dropped-off or picked-up on Lyons Road.

## Dismissal Reminders:

- Woodlands Middle School Dismisses at 4:00pm. Per Florida Statute 1003.31, students are to be picked up no later than 30 minutes after school is dismissed. Please make arrangements to have students picked-up by 4:30pm.

# Choice Transportation

- The School Board shall provide transportation for all students who are enrolled in Choice schools and programs who reside more than two miles from the choice school or program, and who reside within a designated choice transportation zone.
- Bus stops for Choice schools or programs may be limited and may not be within walking distance of a student's home. Choice bus routes average a longer ride time than routes to a zoned school.
- Additional bus stops will not be created for students who reside within the choice transportation zone regardless of the student's proximity to the nearest stop.

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
