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PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

We are heading into the final stretch of the school year. Elementary school is in the third and final trimester; middle school begins the fourth quarter next month. With that being said, teachers, parents, and students must remain vigilant with academics.

One of the most effective and easiest way to help your child succeed academically is to make sure they attend school every day and for the entire day. Our theme is "Attend Today, Achieve Tomorrow". In addition, punctuality matters — lost minutes = lost learning. Standardized testing will begin in April for students in grades K, 1, and 2. FAST testing for grades 3 though 8 will begin in May.

March brings some seasonal and time changes for us all. One is daylight savings time begins on March 9th. You will need to move your clocks ahead one hour. Spring break begins March 24th for our students. Students will return to school on April 1, 2025.

March is also a time for end-of-year field trips. Our 3rd, 4th, 5th graders and Middle schoolers will all be going on end-of-year field trips. In addition, Safety Patrols will be heading to Washington D.C. on March 5th through March 7th. This is an annual tradition that began in 1948. The patrols will be travelling by plane. KINDERGARTEN NEWS

Our Kindergarteners continue practicing reading and writing CVC words as well as reading high frequency words with fluency. We have been writing opinion or argumentative texts which means we state our opinion and tell one reason we feel that way. We are continuing to work on the writing process of planning, drafting, editing or revising, and publishing. Expectations are still growing! We are writing a complete sentence that starts with a capital letter and ends with a period. In English we streeeetch out our words and write down the sounds we hear. In Spanish we break words into their syllables and write the sounds we hear within each syllable. We are still working our way to 100 in Math by counting and representing numbers!

FIRST GRADE NEWS

First Graders will be enjoying a field trip to Loggerhead Marinelife Center this month to learn about veterinary science, sea turtle characteristics, and the role sea turtles play in our oceans. Meanwhile, our upcoming units of study are perfect for incorporating learning experiences at home. In Math, we are learning how to identify and count coins. There are so many variations of coins that there is no better way to learn than real life experience. Please take every opportunity to allow your child to help you count money while shopping or to count the savings in a piggy bank. Our next unit in Benchmark will be Past, Present and Future. This is a great time to talk about heritage and share stories of ancestors. As always, please remember to read with your child every day and keep up with their word work homework.

SECOND GRADE NEWS

We are well on our way into Trimester 3 and the 2nd Graders are working so hard! In ELA we are finishing up Unit 6 and will soon be working in Unit 7 where we will learn all about Investigating the Past! We are still continuing to build up our reading stamina and are diving deeper into our interests through researching and writing! In Science, we are finishing up Unit 7 and will soon be working in Unit 8 where we will explore and learn about Rocks Becoming Soil! In Math, we are working in unit 11 where we are practicing Adding and Subtracting with Numbers within 1,000! We hope that you have a relaxing Spring Break! Please continue to monitor your child's backpack and stay in constant communication with your child's teacher! We can't wait for even more learning and adventures in 2nd Grade!

THIRD GRADE NEWS

Dear Parents of our third graders,

It is imperative these last few months of school, that each student be focused and complete classwork and or homework since third grade is mandatory retention for the students that do not know the reading standards of the state. FOURTH GRADE NEWS

Fourth grade is looking forward to our upcoming field trip and a much-earned Spring Break. However, before our break we still have a lot to do. We are busy writing five paragraph expository essays and are working very hard to improve our writing skills. Students need to use correct capitalization and punctuation in addition to answering the prompt, citing evidence from the articles and elaborating. In math we are learning how to compare, add and subtract decimals. We are finishing our mythology, legends and folktales ELA unit. We are also learning how to annotate properly and summarize our reading. Soon we will begin an informational unit where we will be learning about the transcontinental railroad. In science we have been learning about the rotation of Earth and moon phases. Students must continue to complete their homework nightly and should also be reading every night. Students should also practice their math skills, including learning their multiplication facts.

Fifth grade is working hard and it shows! We just finished up our unit on multiplying and dividing fractions. We are now working on finding the volume of shapes. In ELA, we are working on a fiction unit, focusing on the theme of survival and how the characters face their challenges. In Science we have been learning about Forces. FROM THE DESK OF YOUR HEALTH CARE DISTRICT SCHOOL NURSE:

Your smile is one of the first things people notice about you. It is important to take care of it right from the start. The American Dental Association (ADA) recommends that children visit the dentist within six months of their first tooth and before their first birthday for a "Well Baby Check Up." February is Dental Health Month

Recommendations for good dental health include:

- Brushing your teeth for two minutes, twice a day with fluoride toothpaste
- Flossing daily
- Avoiding sugary and starchy snacks
- · Wearing a mouth guard when you're active
- Not smoking
- Not piercing your lips or any part of your mouth
- Getting dental sealants
- Considering a fluoride program if your water is not fluoridated
- Visiting your dentist regularly for check-ups and cleaning

Children with good oral health have better attendance and fewer problems in school.


