Validating emotions


- Be accepting of negative emotions. Some people believe that negative emotions are unacceptable, so they hold them until they erupt. Explain to your student that it is normal to have a range of feelings, and encourage them to acknowledge them.
- Don't minimize. Middle School is a time of big emotions. Show your student that you understand how they are feeling and that you want to help, even if whatever your student is upset about seems minor to you.
- Communicate. Keep communication channels open, even if it seems your student wants to talk to their friends more than you. Remind them often that they can always talk to you about anything. Pay attention to nonverbal cues as well. These are an indicator of how a student is doing.



Our Superstar Special Olympics athletes competed in the 2025 Region 5 Track Meet. The event was held on April 13th at Traz Powell Stadium in Miami.

Mateus Aragao-Mota finished 1st in the Running Long Jump with a distance of 3.32 meters (10.89 feet) and 1st in the 800 Meter Run with a time of 2:55.86. Awesome job earning Two GOLD Medals!

Mrs. Howard is THRILLED to announce that Mateus, Amelia, Klohe and Lorenzo have been selected to attend the 2025 Summer State Games at Disney's Wide World of Sports on May 16th and 17th. They will be competing against other Special Olympics athletes from around the State of Florida. This is also where they conclude the Law Enforcement Torch Run during Opening Ceremonies. They bring the Flame Of Hope into the Stadium with representatives from more than 300 law enforcement agencies from the State of Florida. Mateus participated in the 2025 Palm Beach County Torch Run on April 16th. He ran from the shopping center at Hypoluxo and Dixie Hwy to Royal Palm School (behind Santaluces High School). He was very excited to join the local law enforcement agencies, including the School District of Palm Beach County.
