### **CLASSROOM NEWS**



#### KINDERGARTEN NEWS

Our Kindergarten Tigers will be moving on to our second Reading and Writing Unit: Every Story has Characters. We will be learning how to describe characters, settings, and important events to develop a deeper understanding of what we are reading. In Writing, we will respond to the stories we read and create narratives with events that happen in chronological order. Math continues with counting, representing, then eventually comparing numbers 0 all the way to 10.

#### FIRST GRADE NEWS

Our first graders had fun learning all about living things and their life cycles in Reading and Science. As our life cycle study concludes in Reading, we are beginning our study of fictional characters. Our character study comes at the perfect time for enjoying a Character Celebration at the end of the month. We are also excited to announce that we will be beginning a take home Word Work program for studying new phonic skills and sight words. More information about how you can help your child with these materials will be coming soon.

#### SECOND GRADE NEWS

2nd Grade is growing strong! We are learning every day and are excited about our units of study! In ELA, we just started Unit 2 where we are learning about Characters Facing Challenges! We are settling into our reading environments as we continue to work on building our reading stamina! In Science, we are exploring and learning about The Needs of Living Things and How Living Things Change! In Math, we are working on Fluently Adding and Subtracting with Sums and Differences within 100! Please continue to your child's backpack and monitor communication with your child's teacher through ClassDojo. We can't wait for more continued excitement in 2nd Grade!

#### THIRD GRADE NEWS

Dear Parents of our Third Grade

We are wrapping up instruction on informational text. Next, we will dive into a fictional text paying attention to characters and themes. We are currently working on Multiplication and division two step problems. Please see the students study their basic facts of multiplication using flashcards that were provided. We have a few fun activities coming up in October. Please join us.

#### FOURTH GRADE NEWS

We have been very busy in fourth grade this month. Everyone had fun at our first dance. We just finished our first unit in ELA and have begun our second unit about character actions and reactions. We continue working on our expository essays during our writing block. In math we have completed the unit on place value and are working on multiplying multi digit numbers by 1-digit numbers. Everyone is looking forward to Hispanic Heritage Night on Thursday, October 10th, to Literary-Licious on Friday, October 18th and to the Character Day Parade on Thursday, Please make sure your student is October 31st. doing their homework and practicing their multiplication Please remind them to complete their assignments in class and to always do their best work.

#### FIFTH GRADE NEWS

Fifth grade is working hard! We are getting ready to start our new unit in ELA which is our fiction unit. This unit is all about character relationships. We are working on multiplication in Math, please practice those math facts. In Science we are learning about animal adaptations and survival. The Safety Patrols are selling popcorn this month, please support them and buy popcorn on Fridays. We are going on our first Field Trip to the Kravis Center to see a musical performance next month. More information will be sent home about that. The students have reading and math homework weekly. They should also be reading 30 minutes each. 

#### READING TIPS FOR PARENTS:

From kindergarten through third grade, you may see tremendous growth in your child's literacy development. While your child may receive a lot of educational guidance from their teachers, remember that you play a major role in their success in reading and writing – at every stage of development.

## To help build your child's literacy skills, here are a few things that you can do at home:

- Let your child gradually share some of the reading aloud. You read a sentence, paragraph, or page, then it's your child's turn.
- Take over if your beginner seems tired or discouraged to ensure that reading is always fun, not just hard work.
- If your child cannot sound out a word properly, suggest skipping it, reading the rest of the sentence, and then deciding what word would make the most sense.
- Leave notes on the refrigerator or in a lunch bag for your child to discover and read.
- Take your new reader to the library to sign up for his or her own library card.

## Try introducing the following types of books to your child:

- 1. "Read-Aloud" books with plots to follow (and challenge) vocabulary.
- 2. Easy-to-read books your child can read alone.
- 3. Select a variety of books, including nonfiction, magazines, and poetry.

October is bullying awareness month. This is a great time to talk with your children about bullying.

- Take bullying seriously. Make sure your kids understand that you will not tolerate bullying at home or anywhere else. Set rules about bullying and stick to them. If you punish your child by taking away privileges, be sure it's meaningful. For example, if your child bullies other kids via email, text messages, or a social networking site, stop phone or computer privileges for a period of time. If your child acts aggressively at home, with siblings or others, put a stop to it. Teach more appropriate (and nonviolent) ways to react, like walking away.
- Teach kids to treat others with respect and kindness. Teach your child that it is wrong to make fun of differences like race, religion, appearance, special needs, gender, etc. Try to instill a sense of empathy for those who are different. Consider getting involved together in a community group where your child can interact with kids who are different.
- Learn about your child's social life. Look for insight into what may be influencing your child's behavior at school or wherever the bullying happens. Talk to your kids about relationships with friends and peers and about the pressures to fit in. Get them involved in activities outside of school so that they meet and develop friendships with other kids.
- **Encourage good behavior.** Positive reinforcement can be more powerful than negative discipline. Catch your kids being good. When they handle situations in positive ways, take notice and praise them for it.
