Dear Parent/Guardian,

The Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) is a progress monitoring system that is administered three times per year to track your student's progress in learning the Benchmarks for Excellent Student Thinking (B.E.S.T.) Standards throughout this school year. The purpose of this letter is to inform you that your student will take the:

Kinder STAR Early Literacy on 4/16/25 and Math on 4/23/25
1st and 2nd Grade STAR Reading on 4/15/25 and Math on 4/22/25

The results from PM3 will show how well your student has mastered the grade level content standards, and your school will provide information about how to access the results.

Your student's FAST assessments are computer-adaptive tests taken on a computer or tablet. The questions get less or more difficult depending on how a student responds, and each student will see different questions. If you or your student would like to review Star Early Literacy, Star Reading, and/or Star Math sample items at home, sample test items are available at <a href="https://flfast.org/families.html">https://flfast.org/families.html</a>.

The Star Early Literacy assessment typically takes less than 15 minutes to complete. The Star Reading assessment is usually completed in less than 20 minutes, and the Star Math assessment typically takes less than 30 minutes to complete.

Students are learning through classroom guidance several relaxation exercises to help them release stress or anxiety they might be experiencing. We will continue to support our students by teaching them study skills, test preparation skills, and coping skills for test anxiety. Don't forget to keep reading and make your station in Spanish!!




Parent University/PLC Meeting- We will be having our second ESOL Parent Meeting on Wednesday, April 30th at 6:00 p.m. in the cafeteria entitled "Resources for U". Mrs. Dankwardt and Ms. Contreras' Dual Language classes will be performing. Please plan on attending. We look forward to seeing you there!

#### Kindergarten:

Hello families! Spring has sprung and we are starting the final two months of school. There is still plenty of learning left before the end of the school year. Please remind your child to still give his or her best effort in school. In, reading, students continue working on building letter-sound relationships and phonemic awareness skills through engaging in meaningful small group lessons and independent activities. Students will continue to learn how to monitor all aspects of reading to engage in and understand texts as a whole. Students will continue to read predictable decodable words using letter/sound relationships. They will also continue reading decodable passages and books.

In math, Students will continue to work on their number sense skills (counting/writing quantities, composing/decomposing). Also, we will continue to explore 2D shapes, 3D shapes, and measurement.

At the end of April, our kindergartners will take their final state test in reading and math. It is very important for students to enjoy a healthy breakfast before school and arrive to school by 8:00 am. It is also advisable that they have a good night's rest. This state test will show their academic growth and mastery of our state standards. This will be their time to shine and show how much they have learned.



Happy spring 1st grade families! We hope you see how much your child has been improving and growing so far this year! They've been working so hard in all academic areas. We are very proud of the efforts the students are putting forth! Please ask them what they are learning in class each day, encourage them to read every night at home and to complete all assignments given to them. In reading, we are focusing on the Past, Present, and Future. At home, discuss why the past is important. In writing, we are creating How to's (for example: How to take care of a dog, How to make a sandwich, How to brush your hair, etc...). At home, talk about how to do things step by step to help with their writing in class (oral language). In math, we are going to identify the value of coins/money. We are going to be practicing the value of different coins and counting by 1's, 5's, 10's, 25's. Please, practice at home how to count money. In science, we will be learning about Earth's natural resources. At home, name and find natural resources (land (soil, rocks, minerals), water, air, plants, and animals). In social studies, we will be looking at ways people and things change over time. At home, discuss and think about the past, present, and future. Thank you for all your support!

#### **Second Grade:**

Happy April from Second Grade! We are getting ready for 3rd grade as we inch closer to the end of the school year! In math we are learning about measurement and 2-D shapes. In reading we are continuing to investigate the past and learning about how the past has shaped our future. Ask us about primary sources! Please remember to check your child's blue communication folder each night to keep with important information and dates!



Happy Spring! As the weather warms up, we celebrate the growth in our school community. This month in reading, we will explore History, Culture, and Geography: Communities Then and Now, followed by Earth Science: Weather and Climate. In math, we will start the unit on Multiply Greater Numbers. Please encourage your child to practice multiplication facts on Reflex Math.

As we near the end of the school year, please remember:

The last FAST (PM3) assessment is coming up (05/01/25 - ELA FAST PM3 & 05/07/25 - MATH FAST PM3). Ensure your child completes all homework and minimizes absences.

Thank you for your support with homework, monitoring your child's agenda and communication folder, staying connected with teachers, and ensuring prompt arrival each day. Your involvement makes a difference!






