Hello Parents and Guardians!

We want your child to be as successful as possible at school. Success in school is not just about reading and math. It is also about knowing how to learn and how to get along with others. In Classroom Guidance, we will be using the Second Step program to teach these critical skills. The Second Step program teaches skills in the following four areas:

1. Skills for Learning: Students gain skills to help themselves learn, including how to focus their attention, listen carefully, and be assertive when asking for help with schoolwork.

2. Empathy: Students learn to identify and understand their own and others' feelings. Students also learn how to take another's perspective and how to show compassion.

3. Emotion Management: Students learn specific skills for calming down when experiencing strong feelings, such as anxiety or anger.

4. Problem Solving: Students learn a process for solving problems with others in a positive way.

Your child will be learning a lot this year—and he or she will need your help! If you have any questions about the Second Step program, please do not hesitate to contact us for more information. Thank you for supporting your child in learning the skills that lead to success in school and in life!

Multi-Agency Resource Center to Open in Wellington

Palm Beach County and the Florida Division of Emergency Management (FDEM) are establishing a Multi-Agency Resource Center (MARC) for individuals impacted by Hurricane Milton. The MARC will be staffed with personnel from federal, state, local partners, and non-profit agencies to ensure residents have access to all available resources following the storm events.

The MARC will open at Village Park Gym Room 1B, 11700 Pierson Road, Wellington, FL 33414, and hours of operations are 8 A.M. to 6 P.M. The MARC will open at 8 A.M. on October 19. The MARC is open to individuals, families, businesses, and nonprofits seeking assistance or needing help in completing applications after being impacted by Hurricane Milton.

Invited agencies include Veteran Affairs, Florida Commerce, Department of Business and Professional Regulation, DCF with mental health counselors and Hope Florida, Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles, Agency for Persons with Disabilities, Office of Insurance Regulation, and Elder Affairs. There will also be contractors from Indelible. They are representing the State to help register people on tablets and laptops with FEMA. The Palm Beach County Long Term Recovery Coalition partners, such as United Way of PBC, Catholic Charities, Salvation Army and The American Red Cross, will be present at the center.

New Worlds Mathematics Scholarship Accounts

Effective July 1, 2023, the New Worlds Scholarship Accounts Program expanded eligibility to include public school students enrolled in kindergarten through grade 5 who:

Exhibit characteristics of dyscalculia Have a substantial deficiency in mathematics

Scored below a Level 3 on the statewide, standardized Mathematics assessment in the prior school year.

Step Up for Students is the only SFO that administers the scholarship to eligible students. Families who wish to apply for the New Worlds Math Math Scholarship Accounts for the 2024-2025 school year may do so through Step Up for Student's Website.





It is hard to believe that November is here! As the leaves begin to change colors and fall from the trees, our Kindergarteners are falling for books! The process of learning to read continues to be the biggest goal for our students. As your child continues to learn and apply each new strategy to his or her reading, an amazing change takes place! The confidence of your child grows and changes and the desire to read becomes a priority to each child. Reading to your child and listening to them read to you each day sends them the message that reading is important to both of you! In math we are introducing Addition to the sum of 10.


We would like to thank you for your support by reading at home, helping your child complete their homework, and practicing math skills. It will make a difference! May you all have a Happy Thanksgiving.



Hello first grade families, the first trimester is almost over!! Just a reminder, report cards will be in your child's portal tile under SIS (no hard copy). Please make sure your email address and phone numbers are updated. We want to make sure you're receiving all important calls and emails. Thank you for your support. We are so PROUD of all the hard work they are doing! In ELA we will begin Unit 3 in Benchmark: Being a Good Community Member. Students will read a variety of genres including: nonfiction, poetry, realistic fiction, and biographies. We will also be writing expository texts, which is research (main idea) and information (details) about a topic. At home, read/listen to a book for at least 15 minutes every day. In Math, we are going to work in Unit 4: Understanding subtraction up to 20. At home, students should be practicing subtraction strategies and ways to take away up to 20. Students should be using objects and number lines to help grasp the concept. . In Science, we will be in Unit 5 Heredity and Reproduction of plants and animals. Our students will be making observations that plants and animals closely resemble their parents. At home, discuss the different kinds of animals and their offsprings. In Social Studies, we will be learning about the history of Native Americans and their contributions.

Second Grade:

Happy November from Second Grade! We are so excited for the fall season and cooler weather! In math we have been learning about using different strategies to subtract numbers up to 100. In reading we have been learning about government workers and how their jobs help impact our lives. Ask us about what smoke jumpers do! Please remember to check your child's blue communication folder each night to keep with important information and dates!



Time has flown by, and we find ourselves nearing the Thanksgiving break already! The first-trimester report cards will be available in your student's portal on November 8, 2024.




