- 2. **To improve language acquisition, literacy skills, and reading comprehension:** emphasize reading strategies that enhance students' abilities to acquire and use information, understand concepts using a summary frame strategy within a lesson, and demonstrate practical application of these concepts.

School staff will collaborate with students and their parents/families to support students' academic success by:

- Providing a safe, supportive, and effective learning environment to enhance student achievement.
- Administrators utilizing all available and appropriate interventions before suspending students.
- Administrators consistently conducting weekly classroom visits to ensure academic rigor and relevance.
- School counselors using data to provide interventions for students who are failing or falling behind.
- School counselors working closely with students to explore potential study paths and set individual goals for deepening their knowledge in areas of interest.
- Teachers establishing positive teacher-student relationships to increase cooperation and engagement in the classroom.
- Teachers fostering an environment that encourages student investment in learning through critical thinking and problem solving.
- Teachers using complex texts, discussions, and authentic tasks to scaffold learning.
- Communicating with parents through flyers, emails, and phone calls to keep them informed and involved in student academics.
- Providing additional incentives through the School-wide Positive Behavior Interventions and Support Initiative.

Parents/families will work with their child and school staff to support students' academic success by:

- Ensuring their child attends school daily, arrives on time, is prepared, and ready to learn.
- Establishing a positive and open line of communication with their child's teachers.
- Monitoring their child's grades and assignment submissions through the Gateway Student Information System (SIS).
- Taking an active role in their child's education by volunteering and attending parent training events to learn strategies that will boost their child's academic success.
- Attending parent conferences to collaborate with teachers and guidance counselors in the decision-making process regarding their child's education and academic success.

Students will work with parent/family and their teachers to improve their academic success by:

- Sharing learning experiences with parents.
- Bringing home and sharing all school communications with parents.
- Attending school daily, arriving to each class on time prepared and ready to learn
- Adhering to school rules and procedures.
- Taking ownership of their learning.
