WE CAN'T WAIT TO SEE YOU! Our teachers arrived back on campus Monday, and they have been working to contact all families to introduce themselves and invite you to Meet and Greet. If you have not received communication from your teacher by this evening, please reach out to the front office for assistance. Of course, staff will be on hand Friday to direct you to the appropriate classroom, even if you do not know the teacher. Please come see the classroom, meet the teachers, buy your spirit gear and PE Uniform, join PTA, and bring in your child's classroom supplies.



Meet and Greet on Friday, August 9, will be the only time you can walk your child to class.

School Safety

Adults on Campus

In order to ensure the safety of all staff and students, **no parents or visitors will be allowed to walk students to class, even the first day/week of school!**

It is important that your child knows the name of their teacher. Please write your child's name somewhere inside his/her backpack with the grade and teacher name in the event he/she needs

assistance getting to class. Adults and Safety Patrols will be on post throughout campus to help guide and escort students to class.

School Hours

The first day of school for students is Monday, August 12, 2024! The exception is our Kindergarten students. Please adhere to the "staggered start" schedule that your child's teacher shares with you. Kindergarten students will be assigned a start day of either Monday OR Tuesday OR Wednesday. Then all Kindergarten students will be together on Thursday!

Student hours are 8:00 a.m. - 2:05 p.m. Please make sure your child is here before the 8:00 a.m. bell or they will be marked tardy. Doors to the school open at 7:30 a.m.

There is no early dismissal after 1:15 p.m. If you need to pick your child up early for any reason, please make sure you get here before 1:15 p.m.

If you need to change the way your child is going home on a particular day, your request must be done **in writing** to the teacher. If you forget to write a note, you must call the main office BEFORE 1:15 p.m. so the office staff has time to let the teacher know about the change. Dismissal is a challenging time of the day and the need to keep all students safe is our top priority. For this reason, these expectations will be enforced.

Arrival Procedures

Car Riders 🚗:

🚗 **PreK drop-off** is in the Main Loop. Pull all the way forward to the end of the covered walkway. PreK staff will be on duty at 7:35 a.m. to unload your child from the car and escort them into the building. **REMAIN IN YOUR CAR** and wait for the staff members on duty. Please **DO NOT LEAVE YOUR CAR** and gather at the gate as this causes a traffic jam in the parking lot when there are cars left unattended.

🚗 Students in **Voluntary PreKindergarten (VPK)** must be walked to the exterior classroom doorway by their adult. Students in this program must be signed in and out daily. Please park in the main lot, cross at the crosswalk, and walk your child to the exterior door.

🚗 Students in **Kindergarten and First Grade** should be dropped off in the K/1 Loop on the south side of the school.

🚗 Students in **2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th** should be dropped off in the Main Loop. **DON'T FORGET THAT 2ND GRADERS HAVE NOW MOVED INTO THE "BIG KID" LOOP AND YOU WILL PICK UP AND DROP OFF IN THE MAIN LOOP.**

Morning drop off in the Main Loop goes very smoothly when everyone follows the expectations:

1. Drive all the way up to the white line where Officer Diaz and Ms. White stand.
2. Once the car line stops, your child can get out of the car ANYWHERE along the sidewalk in front of the school
3. Only parents who drop off for VPK, staff, and visitors should use the left lane.
4. Visitor parking spots are reserved for parents that need to go to the office. Please refrain from using these spots if you are not going into the building.

5. If you come after the 8:00 bell, you must park and sign your child in.

It is not necessary for any families to park in the lot and cross the drive to get to the building, with the exception of VPK students. This helps keep traffic moving and maintains safety and security on our campus. Please trust us that your child WILL enter the building safely and we will get them on their way to class!

Walkers 🚶: South Walkers will enter the gate on the south side of campus and North Walkers will enter by the crossing guard on the north side. NO ADULTS are allowed past the gates. There are staff and safety patrols posted along the path to assist students to class.

Bus Riders 🚌: If your child is eligible to ride the school bus, please follow the directions in this newsletter to register your student for the bus. This will tell you the bus stop and the time for pick up and drop off. **Students MUST be registered prior to the start of school in order to ride the bus.** If you have questions about transportation, please call 561-357-1110.

Late Arrival

Chronic tardiness can cause students to fall behind academically and lead to increased stress levels for you and the student.

Doors to the school open at 7:30 a.m. Supervision starts at 7:30 a.m., therefore students should not be dropped off prior to 7:30 a.m.

If your child arrives to school after the 8:00 a.m. bell rings, **you will have to park and come to the office to sign your child in.** To ensure the safety of all students, you are not permitted to drop students off alone. Every child MUST be accompanied by an adult to sign in and get a late pass.



Dismissal Procedures

Car Riders 🚗:

👉 Students in Kindergarten and First Grade should be picked up in the K/1 Loop on the south side of the school. If your K/1 student has an older sibling, the older sibling will meet the K/1 student in the K/1 loop for dismissal.

👉 Students in 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th should be picked up in the Main Loop. **DON'T FORGET THAT 2ND GRADERS HAVE NOW MOVED INTO THE "BIG KID" LOOP AND YOU WILL PICK UP AND DROP OFF IN THE MAIN LOOP.**



We ask that you pull all the way up to the staff on duty. They will use your provided car sign to call your student to the appropriate cone. These signs will be provided to families at Meet and Greet and throughout the first week of school. For safety purposes, students WILL NOT be dismissed to cars that do not have the appropriate signage. Thank you to our Business Partner, PuraVida Wellness Center, for providing our car tags!

Please **REMAIN IN YOUR CAR at all times**. We will have extra supervision to assist your child into the car in the afternoon.

Walkers 🚶: South Walkers will be walked out to the gate on the south side of campus and North Walkers will be walked out by the crossing guard on the north side. Please let the teacher know if you are allowing your child to walk alone or if they need to be held until an adult picks them up.

All Kindergarten students that are walkers will be held at the gate until they are picked up by an adult. **ABSOLUTELY NO KINDERGARTEN STUDENTS** will be released alone at the walker gate. **⚠️⚠️Families MUST remain outside the gate and wait for students to be escorted to them by our staff members.⚠️⚠️**

Bus Riders 🚌: If your child is eligible to ride the school bus, please follow the directions in this newsletter to register your student for the bus. This will tell you the bus stop and the time for pick up and drop off. **Students MUST be registered prior to the start of school in order to ride the bus**. If you have questions about transportation, please call 561-357-1110.

Mandatory Student ID's

All students will be provided with an ID and grade level colored lanyard that stays in school and an ID that remains on the student backpack. Please remind your child to take care of their lanyard and ID.

ID's are used in the cafeteria, the Media Center, and for safety purposes when walking on campus. In addition, bus riders are required to have an ID available as they are scanned onto the bus.

All students are provided with the first ID and lanyard. If lost or damaged, we will provide an additional ID at no additional cost. Additional replacement ID's are \$5.00 and your student will bring home a notification letter alerting you of the payment due.

If your child would like to have their own special lanyard, please make sure you purchase a "BREAKAWAY" lanyard. If it is not breakaway, your child will not be able to wear it at school for safety reasons.

Grade Level ID's

Each student will keep this tag in school. It will have:

1. Grade level colored breakaway lanyard
2. School ID with photo (if they took a photo last year), barcode, and name
3. Grade level colored line across the top
4. The school year



ID Tag on Backpack

Students must keep this ID (with NO PICTURE) on the backpack all year.



Colored Dismissal Tag

Depending on how your child goes home, he/she will have a colored band to alert staff where students need to go at dismissal (walker, car rider, bus rider, etc.). Keep this on the backpack all year. Make sure your child's teacher knows how your child will get home.

Mandatory Uniform Dress Code Policy

General Information

Research and experience show that the way students dress has a direct influence on how they behave. Since the Meadow Park School Community expects only the BEST behavior from our students, the School Advisory Council reached consensus to initiate a mandatory Uniform Dress Code Policy.

SHIRTS & BLOUSES

- Polo style shirts-any solid color
- Meadow Park school shirt (polo or t-shirt) or sweatshirt
- Meadow Park PE Uniform
- Any solid color sweat shirt



SHOES

- Shoes must be worn at all times.
- Sneakers, loafers, or other closed toe shoes are required.
- No open, unsafe footwear such as flip-flops, sandals, clogs, platform shoes or soles over one-inch.
- No heeys with or without wheels.
- No crocs



★ Remember student have P.E./Recess daily

Dress Code Violations

Violations will result in:

- Parent contact
- Student required to change to meet dress code.
- Additional consequences will apply for habitual or major infractions.
- Students with inappropriate shoes will sit out of P.E. or recess.

Pants & Shorts

- Pants and shorts must be solid navy blue, black, gray or khaki.
- Students may wear navy blue or black denim on FRIDAYS or Spirit days (no holes or patches).
- No short-shorts or spandex
- The length of shorts/skorts/skirts/jumpers must be no more than 2-3 inches above the knee.
- Pants/Shorts must be worn at the natural waistline.



ITEMS NOT ALLOWED

- Hats or Caps
- Tank tops, halter tops, midriffs
- T-shirts with inappropriate language or pictures
- Clothes with holes
- Backless or cutoff clothing
- Large, oversized earrings/jewelry

Palm Beach County dress code restrictions continue to apply.

- ★ Exceptions are made on picture days and some spirit days. The school will notify you of any changes.
- ★ Put your child's name on sweatshirts.



Póliza Código de vestir/Uniforme Obligatorio

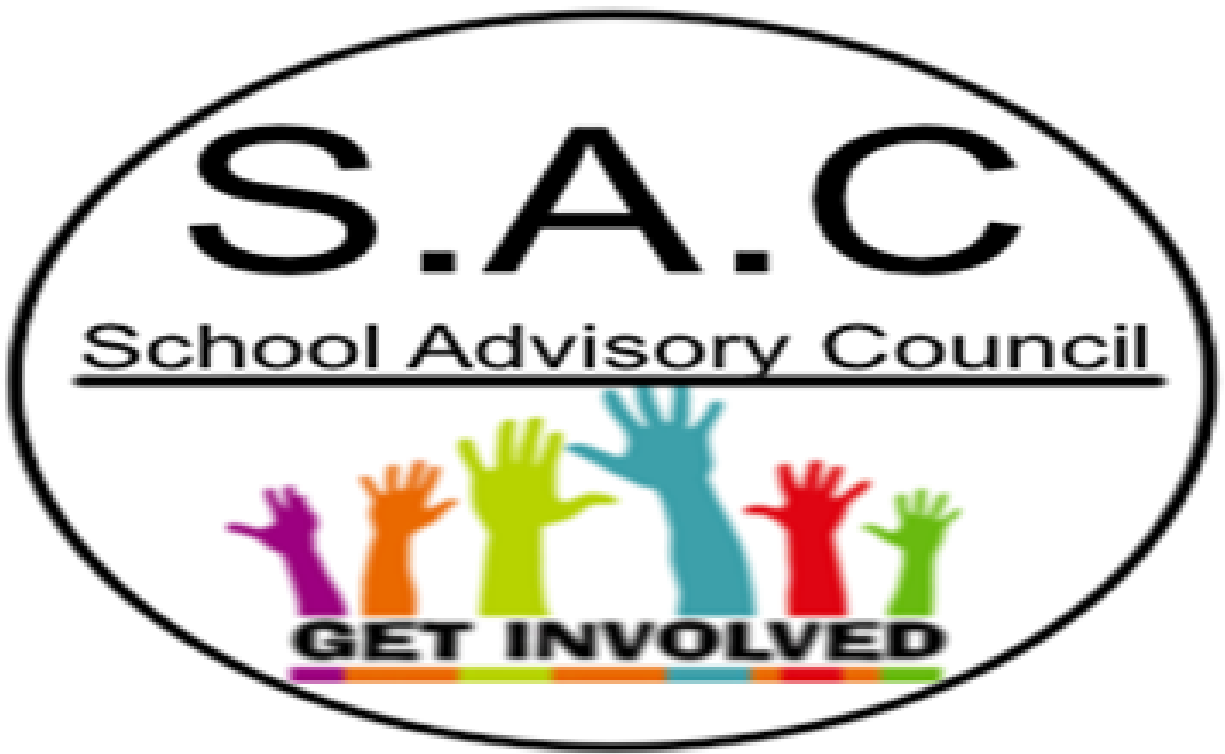

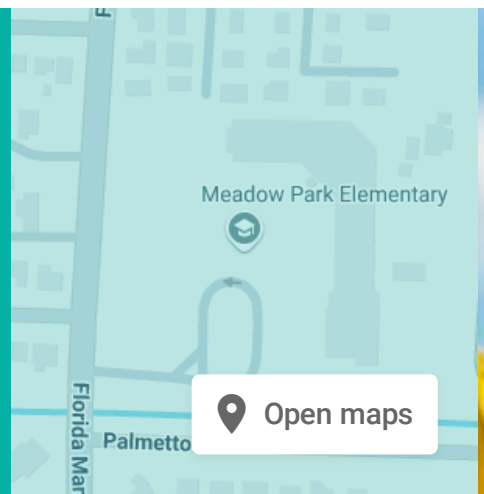
