Grade Level Updates

Pre-K and VPK

PK just wrapped up its Frogstreet unit on Color, Shape, and Size. For the month of November, our theme is Safe and Healthy Me. Our students will learn rules about health and safety. Kindergarten

Our little learners have enjoyed responding to stories and describing characters. We're excited to begin answering the essential question: Why do we have rules? As we will soon begin, Unit 3 - Rules at Home and School. The 2nd trimester will lead us to beginning addition in Math. And Science we will continue our exploration of Parents and their Young!

First Grade

Happy Fall!! 1st Graders have been working hard on adding to 20 using different math strategies. We are now moving on to subtracting using different math strategies. In ELA we have finished our unit on learning about characters in a story. We will now be learning about Our Community. Please continue to help your child practice reading at home and help them complete their homework correctly. Thank you for your support!

Second Grade

Second graders are doing great and working hard! In reading we are starting our unit on learning all about our government and communities! In math we are continuing to work on our addition and subtraction skills with two-digit numbers. Science we are finishing up our unit on animal needs and habitats. Continue practicing math facts at home and reading every night! Thank you for all your support!

Third Grade

Third graders have been working so hard! In Math, they finished up the unit on geometry and learning about area and perimeter. Please keep practicing multiplication and division facts at home.

Reading Unit 3 the essential question is: Why do people participate in government? Students will summarize stories, explain information and text features, and cause and effect. **Science** is about vertebrates. We are looking forward to our Thanksgiving lunch on 11/21.

Fourth Grade

Math- We are starting our division unit. Continue to practice multiplication facts every night!

Reading-In unit 3 government in action, students will read informational texts and fictional stories about the interactions between citizens and government.

Science- Matter is everywhere!

Writing-On November 18-20 we will be taking our Write Score Assessment Expository. Have your child show you their writing on google classroom!

Fifth Grade

Our 5th graders are diving into some exciting new learning units!

In reading, students are about to start Unit 3: The U.S. Constitution: Then and Now, where they'll explore the essential question, "Why do laws continue to evolve?"

In writing, students are working hard on crafting strong body paragraphs with clear evidence and thoughtful elaboration, making sure not to just repeat information. Coming up on November 18th, students will take their second Write Score Assessment to see how much they've grown as writers!

In math, students are starting Unit 5: Dividing Multi-Digit Whole Numbers, and will move on to Unit 6: Understanding Division with Decimals. Don't forget to keep up with weekly i-Ready assignments! Report cards will be available soon—stay tuned!

In Science, we will explore the Properties and Changes in Matter. Stay Tuned for information about the mandatory Science Fair Projects requirements and due dates.



New Worlds Reading Initiative

For those unfamiliar: What is New Worlds Reading?

Created by the Florida legislature in 2021 and administered by the UF Lastinger Center for Learning, New Worlds Reading is Florida's free at-home literacy program for VPK - 5th graders in VPK programs and public and charter schools who are not yet reading on grade level.

Eligibility Information

Eligible students receive nine free books and reading activities each school year through fifth grade, even if their reading scores improve. Families choose books they want to receive to spark their child's interest in reading, and the activities reinforce science of reading strategies to help students strengthen their skills. Select books will be available in Spanish, Haitian Creole, Braille, or large print.

- For students in VPK:
 - scoring below the 40th percentile on FAST Star Early Literacy/Reading.
- For students in grades K-2:
 - scoring below the 40th percentile on FAST Star Early Literacy/Reading or receiving Tier 2 or Tier 3 Reading Intervention Support (as reported by districts in Survey 2 and Survey 3).
- For students in grades 3 5:
 - scoring below Level 3 on FAST assessments or receiving Tier 2 or Tier 3 Reading Intervention Support (as reported by districts in Survey 2 and Survey 3).
