Please be reminded that there is no school on Monday, October 14. Please read on for important information, and I look forward to seeing you all at our upcoming events!



support for our students, staff, and community.



Updates from Mrs. Haag, SSCC

We have many grade level activities that have been planned to celebrate Hispanic Heritage month. Our 5th grade students are researching and presenting a Wax Museum for the 2nd-4th grade classes next Friday, October 11th. Please be sure to complete the Activities Permission Form so that your child can participate.

Students in kindergarten through 5th grade have all begun their second reading unit focusing on characters, events and plot of stories. As you continue to read with your children at home you can support them by asking questions about how and why characters act or react within the stories they are reading; where the story takes place and how that setting might affect the character's actions in the story or how the character may change from the beginning of a book to the end.

Students in 3rd through 5th grade are also working on their typing skills with the Typing Club app on their portal. These skills are necessary to become proficient in typing for online assessments such as the State Writing assessment for all 4th and 5th grade students this spring.

Grade Level Updates

Pre-K and VPK

PK had a fun week exploring Community Helpers. We had visits from a nurse, a mail carrier, the fire department, and police officers. Thank you to all the volunteers who took the time to come share with our students. Next week PK begins unit 3 - Color, Shape, Size. We will work on classifying by colors, shapes, and sizes. We will continue working on following our rules/commitments and calm breathing. This week the calm breathing is Balloon Breathing. Please practice it at home and use it when needed.

Kindergarten

Our Kindergarten learners are displaying great independence and excitement for school. We are proud to see so many routines and procedures being followed responsibly. In reading we are learning about characters and answering the essential question, How are Characters different? In Math we are comparing numbers. In Science we are discovering the needs of animals and plants. Please continue to support your child's independence by helping them to learn to log in to the computer and to tie their shoes with a double knot. Thank you!

First Grade

In reading we are learning about characters. In Math we are learning different strategies to help us add or subtract. In Science we are learning about living and nonliving things. We are getting ready to go on our first field trip! We are going to the Zoo on Tuesday 10/8/24!

Second Grade

In reading we are learning about how characters face challenges. We are learning this by finding the theme in stories, summarizing and character's perspectives. Please read to your child every night for 20 minutes. In math we are learning to add and subtract numbers up to 100 and the different strategies we can use to find the sum. Your child may do iReady math and reading at home for extra practice. Thank you for your continued support!

Third Grade

In Reading, third grade will be working on how characters' decisions impact the story, plot, theme and summarizing. Please have your child do 20 minutes of I-ready reading daily at home. Math is

all about multiplication and division. Keep practicing multiplication facts! The next unit is Geometry and learning facts about shapes. We have a field trip to the Mounts Botanical Garden on 10/30 to learn about plant life cycles and what plants need to survive. Third graders continue to follow the Eagle Way.

Fourth Grade

In reading, we are starting Unit 2. Students will make connections to characters' actions, summarize the key events of a story, use details about characters and events from two texts to compare and contrast a stated theme, and explain how rhyme, structure, and imagery create meaning in a poem. Our test date will be October 22nd.

In math, we will be multiplying multi-digit numbers by two-digit numbers using the area model or standard algorithm. Our test date will be October 28th.

In AMP Math, we will be multiplying decimals. Keep practicing IXL at home!
In writing, we are working on expository essays, as well as paraphrasing and quoting from the text.
Our next Write Score assessment will be coming up in November.

BooGrams will start on October 16th. Students can send a note and a smencil to a friend!

Fifth Grade

We have successfully completed Unit 1 Reading: Cultivating Natural Resources, exploring the question "How do we decide which resources we should develop?" Students completed their Unit 1 test on 9/7. Please check your child's binder for their "Purple Data Sheet" to see their grade or Performance Matters. This week, we're busy preparing for our National Hispanic Heritage Month Wax Museum. Each student has been given a tri-fold board to complete their project, and we can't wait to see their creativity! Students are now diving into Reading Unit 2: Developing Characters' Relationships, focusing on the question "Why do we value certain qualities in people?"

In writing, we're working on making our body paragraphs strong and clear with evidence and elaboration. We're using a prompt about wildfires to explore their impact on the environment and humans.

In math, our Topic 3 test on Multiplying Multi-Digit Whole Numbers will be on 10/4. Afterward, we'll start Topic 4: Understanding Multiplication with Decimals on 10/7.

We've just concluded our exciting science unit on Adaptations and are diving into our next unit: "The Amazing Human Body." In this unit, your child will explore the fascinating world of human anatomy. Students will learn about the various organs that make up our bodies and their important functions.

Our first field trip is Tuesday, October 8th. Sons of Mystro at the Kravis Center.



Safety Updates

Morning Drop Off

Parents, PLEASE help us to keep all students safe and on time to class! If you are driving your child to school, it is imperative that you follow directions given by staff at drop off. This helps to keep the flow of traffic moving to ensure students are getting out safely and getting to class on time. Failure to comply with the School Board's Technology Acceptable Use Policy for Students (School Board Policy 8.123) or the provisions in this Policy may result in the loss of takehome privileges on a non-discriminatory and equitable basis. The School District of Palm Beach County reserves the right to demand the immediate return of the equipment at any time.

New Worlds Reading Initiative

For those unfamiliar: What is New Worlds Reading?

Created by the Florida legislature in 2021 and administered by the UF Lastinger Center for Learning, New Worlds Reading is Florida's free at-home literacy program for VPK - 5th graders in VPK programs and public and charter schools who are not yet reading on grade level.

Eligibility Information

Eligible students receive nine free books and reading activities each school year through fifth grade, even if their reading scores improve. Families choose books they want to receive to spark their child's interest in reading, and the activities reinforce science of reading strategies to help

students strengthen their skills. Select books will be available in Spanish, Haitian Creole, Braille, or large print.

- For students in VPK:
 - scoring below the 40th percentile on FAST Star Early Literacy/Reading.
- For students in grades K-2:
 - scoring below the 40th percentile on FAST Star Early Literacy/Reading or receiving Tier 2 or Tier 3 Reading Intervention Support (as reported by districts in Survey 2 and Survey 3).
- For students in grades 3 5:
 - scoring below Level 3 on FAST assessments or receiving Tier 2 or Tier 3 Reading Intervention Support (as reported by districts in Survey 2 and Survey 3).
