1. Vocabulary Notebook:

Select a poem from <u>https://poets.org/</u> or a school-appropriate song. Do some light research into the background and context of your poem/song. Print a copy of your text and annotate thoroughly.

Your annotations are an opportunity to show your knowledge of poetry; do your best to showcase what you know.

After a careful reading of the poem, complete a short typed reflection (150 - 300 words) on why you chose the text you did and whether your understanding changed/ deepened through the background information and analysis. You may add any information you feel is relevant to share.
