## CLASS OF 2024 OVERVIEW OF JUNIOR COLLEGE PLANNING WORKSHOPS

#### Intro Meeting - January 10th 2023 - 3:30pm

In this session, we will discuss the junior year timeline and common terms you will encounter in the college application process. We will also discuss SAT and ACT registration and preparation, and where to find college information on the Park Vista website.

#### The College Search – January 17th 2023 – 3:30pm

This session will help students learn how to search for colleges and universities and create a college list. We will also take a closer look at the State Universities of Florida and their requirements.

#### College Visits and Interviews - January 24th 2023 - 3:30pm

This session will cover virtual and in-person college campus visits, when to go and why, and what to look for while you're there. We will also talk about other ways to connect with campus representatives, and will touch briefly on the different types of college interviews, their purpose, and what to do if one is offered or required.

#### The College Application - January 31st 2023 - 3:30pm

In this session, we will look at the Common App (the application you will most likely be using to apply) and the different components of the college application. Be prepared for this meeting by opening a Common App account at www.commonapp.org

#### The College Application Essay and Resume - February 7th 2023 - 3:30pm

The essay and resume are crucial components of the college application. In this session, we will discuss what colleges are looking for in essays and resumes, as well as some writing techniques and brainstorming exercises.

#### Financing Your Education – February 21st 2023 – 3:30pm

In this session, we will discuss sources of financial aid such as FAFSA/FFAA/CSS and Bright Futures, and how to search for and apply to other scholarships.

#### Exploring Majors and Careers – March 1st 2022 – 3:30pm

What do you want to be when you grow up? You probably don't know yet, and that's ok! In this session, we will look at some online tools that will help you identify and explore careers that may be a good fit for you.


## Join the PTSO
