Out of Darkness Walk



11 & 12 grade students attending school, who are NOT taking the PSAT, will report to Study Hall in the Cafeteria until the PSAT ends at 12:09pm.




If you are a student who receives extended time, you must remain in the testing room until the approved time is completed. You must stay until the end even if you finish early!!


DUAL ENROLLMENT

The registration window for **Spring 2023** begins on **Wednesday**, **October 12th**. Palm Beach State College representatives held a Dual Enrollment session for our students on September 20th and shared a wealth of information. They provided detailed information about their course offerings which include:

- An opportunity for Seniors Only to take the Introduction to the College Experience course.
 Must have a 2.75 GPA or higher and reading placement score requirement. This is for the Spring 2023 term only.
- Update regarding test score requirements.
- Career Certificate Program opportunities.
 Students must take courses in the program they choose; they can't take one course in one program then choose another program.






