

# PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Park Vista Families,

At Park Vista our Cobras continue to strive academically and through extracurricular activities, supporting our promise to Commit to Excellence every day!

The theme of Celebrate Literacy Week, Florida! January 23 - 27, 2023 was Take a Deep Dive Into Literacy - Splash Into New Worlds! Explore the Sea in 2023! Students engaged in the topic of environmental conservation, specifically related to our oceans and waterways in Palm Beach County. Students created murals of ocean metaphors, wrote about the damage of pollution to aquatic ecosystems, researched ocean conservation, and enjoyed creative writing with an oceanic inspiration.

In celebration of February's Black History Month, Park Vista's Black Student Union, together with Young Black Leaders, have organized a series of activities and events to recognize achievements of Black Americans. Prominent Black Americans will be honored throughout campus with informational posters. Music, film, dance and cultural activities will showcase the impact of Black Americans throughout history.

### YBL and BSU news




