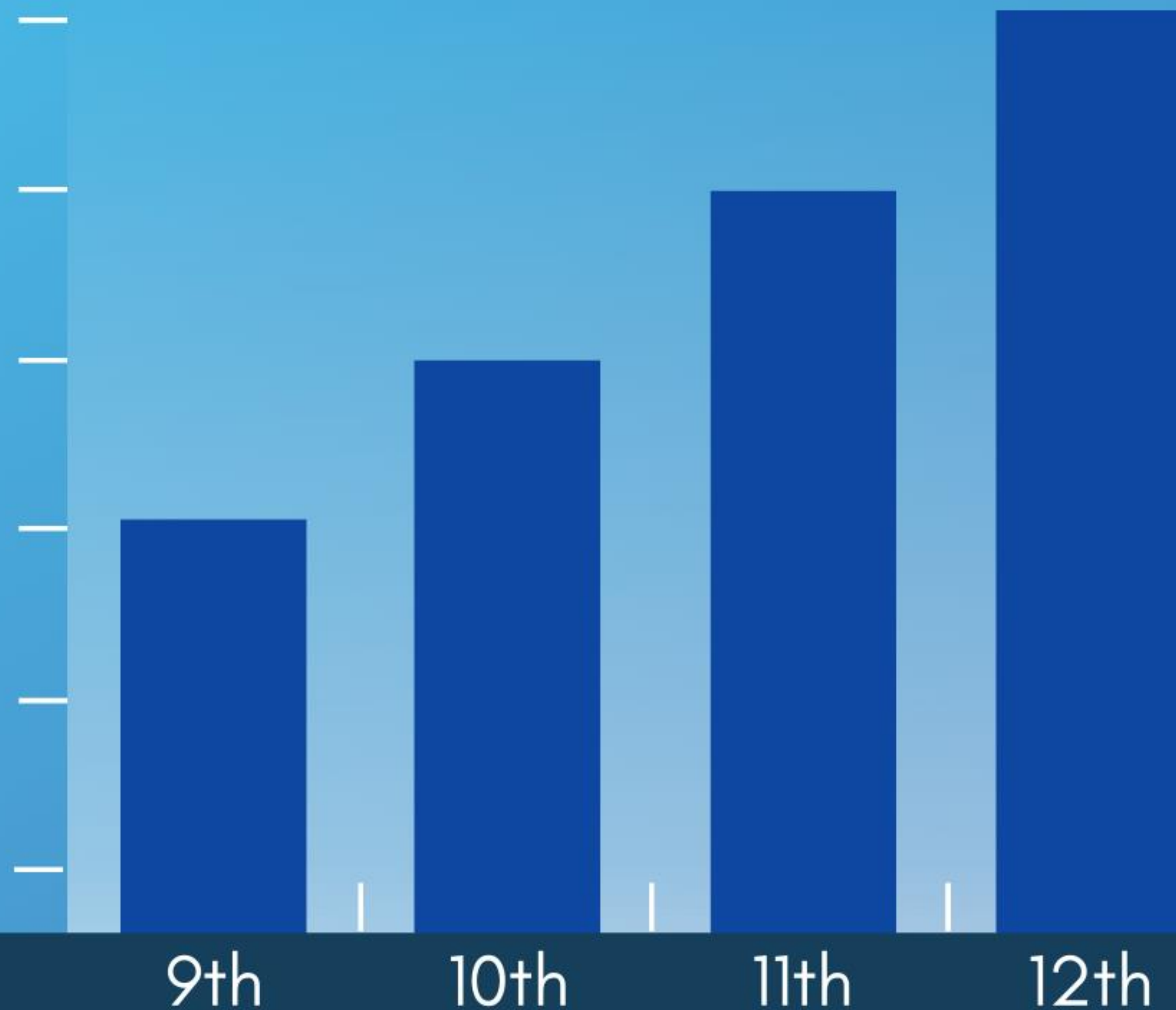
**4 additional academic credits (English, Math, Science, Social Studies or Foreign Language)**

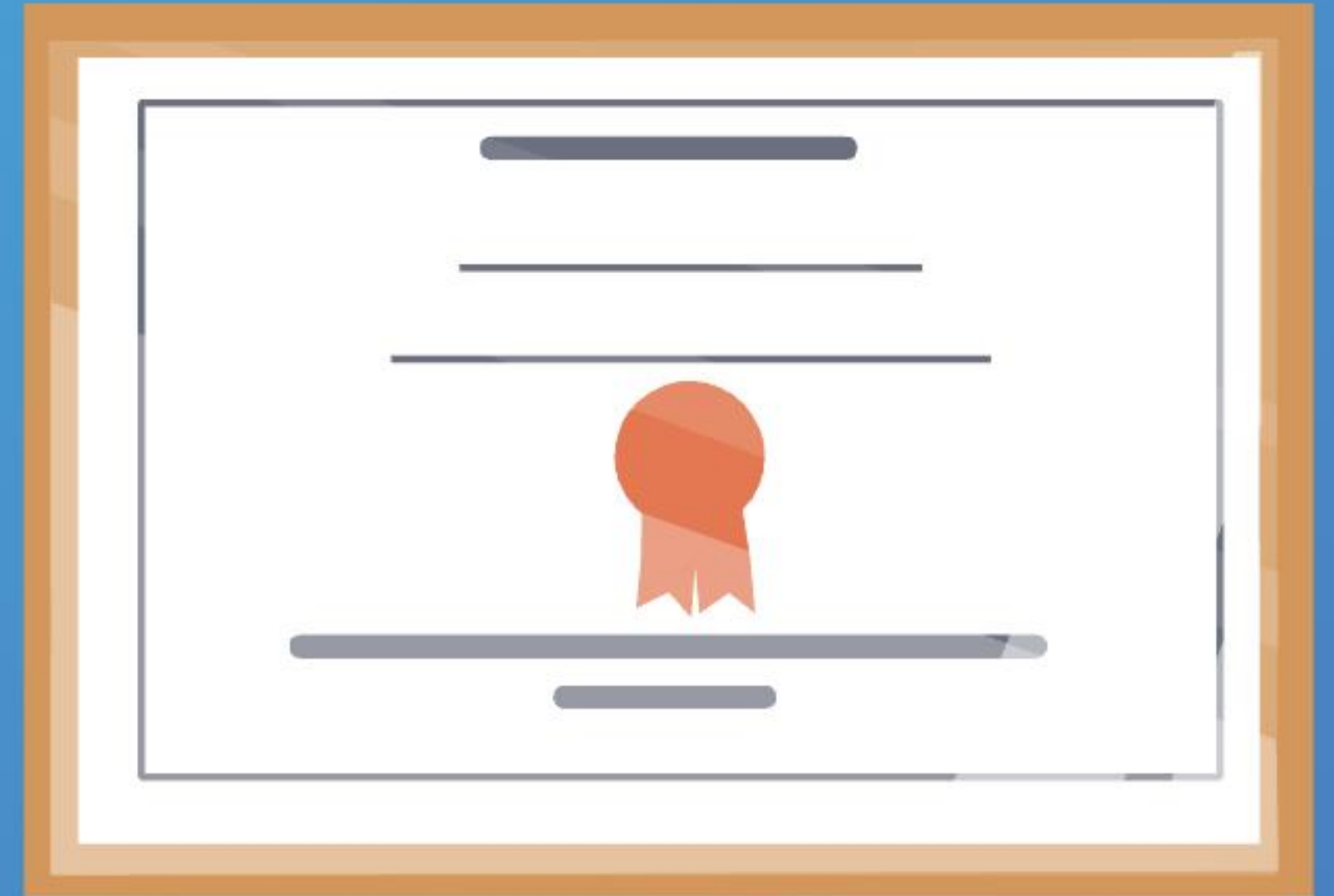
