Welcome Back Seniors, Juniors and Sophomores

On **Wednesday**, **August 3**, **2022** we welcome our seniors, juniors and sophomores to visit and get reacquainted with our campus. This will not be a formal orientation program, however students will have an opportunity to have replacement IDs made, purchase a locker, and check out a Chromebook. Please drop off your incoming 9th graders in front of the Main Office between 7:30 and 8:15 a.m. Doors close by 8:30 a.m. and we encourage our students to be on time. Students will have an opportunity to pick up schedules, tour campus, purchase a locker for \$10.00, get an ID photo taken and check out a Chromebook. Snacks and water will be available for purchase. Our Cobra Ambassador Team, composed of model student leaders, have been preparing fun and informational activities to acclimate our new 9th graders to Park Vista and can't wait to meet them!

Bus Drivers Must "Register Your Ride"!

The School District of Palm Beach County Transportation Services Department is dedicated to partnering with schools, families, and communities to provide safe and efficient transportation in support of school programs and services. Students residing two miles or less from a school are not eligible for transportation per section 1011.68, Florida Statutes, and State Board of Education Rule 6A-3001, Basic Principles for Transportation of Students.

The School District now requires that all bus riders register for their bus. You have to register to ride even if you rode the bus last year.

Choice Program students may receive transportation regardless of their proximity to the Choice school. Parents must provide transportation to the closest bus stop in order to be eligible. Bus stops will only be available within the Choice Transportation Zone for each school and additional stops will not be created. Do not come to the School Counseling Office during class time.

CHANGES WILL ONLY BE CONSIDERED FOR THE FOLLOWING REASONS:

- student is in the wrong level and/or unqualified for the present course
- student has already taken AND passed the present course
- teacher recommendation
- student needs course for graduation (seniors only)
- student has the same class online or in credit lab

CHANGES WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED FOR THE FOLLOWING REASONS:

- student wis hes to change teachers or periods for the same course
- electives will not be changed

JUNIORS & SENIORS

If you did not request periods 6 or 7 off last year, we will not be able to accommodate the request now. The master schedule does not have room for you to now move your period 6 and/or period 7 to earlier in the day. The classes you have periods 6 and/or 7 are now full earlier in the day.

Please realize that dropping an "academic" course may jeopardize graduation and/or admission to a four-year university. If you have any period(s) "off" in your junior or senior years, you are LESS COMPETITIVE in the college application and scholarship process. While it is popular to have periods 6 & 7 off in senior year and period 7 off in your junior year......THIS MAKES YOU MUCH LESS COMPETITIVE IN THE ADMISSION PROCESS!

Park Vista Dress Code

Please refer to the Park Vista Community High School Standard Operating Procedures available on our website, www.pvchs.com.

Acceptable Clothing

- Dresses, skirts, split skirts or shorts must be at least ¾-thigh length
- Long dresses or skirts with slits to facilitate walking may not have a slit that is above the ¾-thigh length standard.
- Blouses, shirts, and tops must have sleeves and must be long enough to be tucked into your pants, shorts, and skirts.
- Necklines must be high enough to prevent the exposure of cleavage.

Prohibited Clothing

- Transparent or see through fabric.
- Clothing, jewelry, buttons, etc. with words, phrases, symbols, pictures or insignia that are disruptive, obscene, profane, racist, suggestive, offensive, or related to drug or alcohol use.
- Clothing that deface, alter or improperly display the national emblem.
- Sunglasses, hats, hoods, bandanas, picks, combs, wave caps, or any type of head covering. If you must wear sunglasses during outside physical education activities, please clear this with the appropriate coach.
- Pants, skirts, or shorts that ride below the base of the spine or hips. Wallet chains, spiked chains, or any other
 type of metal chain.
- Skirts, dresses or shorts shorter than ¾-thigh length or with a slit that reaches above the ¾-thigh length.
- Sleeveless shirts, tank tops, tube tops and spaghetti straps.
- Pants or leggings with holes exposing skin and/or see through material shorter than ¾-thigh length.
- Items containing reference to death, murder or gangs.
- Bare midriffs, backs, or sides.
- Gaiters, gas masks, scarves, and/or handkerchiefs. etc
- Pajamas, bedroom or house slippers, or bare feet.
- Spandex shorts and unitards.

Parents are requested to play an active role in the enforcement of this policy. Students who do not comply with dress code will contact parent or guardian for change of clothing. Students with continuous or flagrant violations of the dress policy are subject to further disciplinary action. Dress code appropriate clothing must be worn on approved SGA dress up days. EXCEPTIONS: Any student who is requesting temporary exemption from the dress code for medical reasons must first present a doctor's note to his or her appropriate assistant principal for approval.

Please note that the dress code goes into effect upon arrival to campus.

Important Safety Reminders



School begins promptly at **7:30 a.m**. and students are dismissed at **2:45 p.m**. Please allow plenty of time to get to school by the first bell. Traffic is backed up along Jog road as early as 6:50 a.m. For your safety, do not drop students off on Jog Road. In efforts to get to school on time, students sometimes jump out of cars and dart through traffic. This is not only illegal, but it is EXTREMELY DANGEROUS! Please protect your child by using safe drop-off procedures.

Due to safety concerns, food and beverage drop-offs by parents and vendors are not permitted.

Please note that there are **no early releases after 2:15 p.m.** This prevents early releases from blocking the entry and exit of school buses and backing up traffic.

Social Media Guide:

Palm Beach County Public Schools realizes that part of 21st century learning is adapting to the changing methods of communication. The importance of teachers, students and parents engaging, collaborating, learning, and sharing in these digital environments is a part of 21st century learning. As such, educational standards are now requiring the use of online educational tools to demonstrate proficiency. To address related issues, PBCSD has developed guidelines to provide direction for students and the school district community when participating in online social media activities.

Social Media refers to the use of web-based and mobile technologies that enable all Palm Beach County Public Schools' internal and external stakeholders to connect, collaborate, and form virtual communities via the computer and/or Internet. For some, social media is used mainly for social purposes, but for others, these sites and technologies are used as tools to teach and to connect with the community. The First Amendment, in general, protects the rights of individuals to participate in social media. However, the laws and courts have ruled that schools can discipline students and staff if their speech, including online postings off campus, materially and substantially disrupts school operations, reasonably likely causes a material and substantial disruption of the school, constitutes a violation of certain relevant federal or state laws or School Board policies.

Since social media reaches audiences far beyond the community and can leave lasting impressions, students must use social sites responsibly and be accountable for their actions. Students should consider not posting or linking anything to social networking sites that they would not want peers, teachers, college admissions officers, or future employers to access. Students should be sure to utilize privacy settings to control access, never share personal information with parties unknown on unsecure sites and be protective of site passwords.

Misrepresentation of someone else's identity must also be avoided. Students should remember to be respectful to others. When responding to someone during a disagreement, be sure that criticism is constructive and not hurtful. Beware of profane, obscene, or threatening language.

If the use or posting to a social media site creates a substantial and material disruption on a school campus, regardless of time or location while posting to a social media site, students will be subject to the behavioral standards set forth in the Student Code of Conduct.
