#### **COURSE SELECTION SUGGESTIONS**

When selecting your courses for next school year, consider the following:

- 1. **Graduation Requirements:** Make sure you are meeting all the necessary graduation requirements.
- 2. **College Goals:** Research the student profiles of colleges you are interested in, and select courses that align with their admission standards/trends.
- 3. **Academic Rigor:** Challenge yourself with AICE, AP, and Dual Enrollment courses in your strength subjects.
- 4. **Explore your Career Interests:** Choose electives that are aligned with your interests and career aspirations.
- 5. **Consider Class Timing and Workload:** Think about your extracurricular, work, and family commitments.
- 6. **Involve your Parents:** Your parents can help provide perspective, and may even know things about your strengths and weaknesses you haven't considered.

# Important SAT, ACT, & CLT Information:

- These tests are used for:
  - College admission
  - Some scholarship eligibility
  - To meet the required State Reading / Math assessment concordant scores.
- Juniors will take a free SAT during school on Wednesday, March 5th. Prepare now!
- These tests are optional (not a graduation requirement), therefore students must register and pay for them on their own.
  - Test Fee Waivers are available to students who qualify for Free/Reduced Lunch.
  - If you qualify, email the F/R Lunch confirmation you received to your school counselor before you register for the SAT or ACT to obtain a Test Fee Waiver.

#### **ABSENCES AND COURSE CREDIT**

Per state and district rules, students are expected to have a 90% attendance rate in each class or they must demonstrate proficiency on the semester exam to earn course credit.

- In Block Classes: If you have 5 or more absences (excused or unexcused) you must pass the semester exam to earn credit.
- In 5th Period Class: If you have 10 or more absences (excused or unexcused) you must pass the semester exam to earn credit.

# If You Have Already Applied to College:

- Application Portals: Each college will email you with a link and login to your application portal
  - Be sure to check your email, login to the college portals, check the status of your applications, and submit any missing documents ASAP.
- Mid-Year Reports: If your college applications require mid-year reports. Click here to request: <u>Transcript Request Form</u>
- SSAR/SPARK: If your college applications required you to complete the SSAR or SPARK, you will need to log in and update your first semester grades in your SSAR or SPARK portal from 'IP' (in progress) to the 1st semester grade you received.

# If You HAVE NOT Applied to College and Plan to Attend:

- APPLY ASAP! Most college applications can be completed via the Common App.
- Know your colleges' application deadlines!

# FAFSA Workshop for Seniors and their Parents - February 26th, 6pm at Dwyer

#### What to Bring Checklist:

- Your Social Security Number for parents and student ( or permanent resident number)
- Date of Birth (parents and students)
- Your most recent federal income tax returns, W-2s, and other records of money earned
- Bank statements for checking, savings, and other assets accounts
- Investment records, including 529 plans of other prepaid college plans
- An FSA ID to sign electronically (A new FSA ID must be created for both the student and one parent use separate e-mail address for each)
- Permanent Residency card (if you are not a U.S. Citizen)
- Driver's license number if you have one
