Important SAT, ACT, & CLT Information:

- These tests are used for:
 - College admission
 - Some scholarship eligibility
 - To meet the required State Reading / Math assessment concordant scores.
- Juniors will take a free SAT during school on Wednesday, March 5th. Prepare now!
 - All Juniors will report directly to their assigned testing room at 7:35am.
- These tests are optional (not a graduation requirement), therefore students must register and pay for them on their own.
 - Test Fee Waivers are available to students who qualify for Free/Reduced Lunch.
 - If you qualify, email the F/R Lunch confirmation you received to your school counselor before you register for the SAT or ACT to obtain a Test Fee Waiver.

• Struggling in a class?

• Absences and Course Credit:

- In Block Classes: If you have 5 or more absences (excused or unexcused) you must pass the semester exam to earn credit.
- In 5th Period Class: If you have 10 or more absences (excused or unexcused) you must pass the semester exam to earn credit.
- In EOC Classes: If you have 10 or more absences (excused or unexcused) for you must pass the 4th quarter to earn credit.

CAREER PLANNING WITH XELLO

F.S. 1003.42(2)(o)(4), requires students in grades 9-12 to explore career pathways using the State's Career Planning Tool: *Xello*. To satisfy this requirement, 9th grade students will complete the Personalized Career and Academic Plan (PCAP) lesson through Xello which is broken into two parts:

- Part 1: 9th grade students will create a 'Future Plan'.
- Part 2: 9th grade students will develop their PCAP Portfolio by creating a 4-Year Course Plan.

Xello is an online program that helps students create their very own, unique roadmap for college, career, and future success. The School District of Palm Beach County parents and guardians may register for *Xello Family Portal* and have access to your child's future goals and plans. Xello parents and guardians the ability to:


- Explore career options with your child.

If You Have Already Applied to College:

- Application Portals: Each college will email you with a link and login to your application portal
 - Be sure to check your email, login to the college portals, check the status of your applications, and submit any missing documents ASAP.
- Mid-Year Reports: If your college applications require mid-year reports. Click here to request: <u>Transcript Request Form</u>
- SSAR/SPARK: If your college applications required you to complete the SSAR or SPARK, you will need to log in and update your first semester grades in your SSAR or SPARK portal from 'IP' (in progress) to the 1st semester grade you received.

If You HAVE NOT Applied to College and Plan to Attend:

- APPLY ASAP! Most college applications can be completed via the Common App.
- Know your colleges' application deadlines!
