



#### Child Caregivers: A Hidden, Vulnerable Population

Across the U.S., child caregivers face immense challenges, often sacrificing their education and health to care for family members with chronic illness, injury, disability, or functional decline.

These young individuals take on adult responsibilities, such as bathing, feeding, administering medications, and more. The stress of caregiving creates barriers to learning, completing school, and experiencing childhood.

Of young adults who dropped out of school, 22% did so to provide care for family members.

The American Association of Caregiving Youth (AACY) established the Caregiving Youth Project (CYP) in 2006 to support student-caregivers and their families at no cost.
