FY23 FEDERAL HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION RATES

On January 22, 2023, the Florida Department of Education (FDOE) released high school graduation rates for the State of Florida and the District. The FY23 Federal High School Graduation Rate includes standard diplomas but excludes special diplomas and General Education Diplomas (GEDs). Students with Disabilities (SWD) on Access Points curriculum are working to earn a standard diploma and are included as graduates, if successful.¹ It should be noted that due to COVID-19, assessment requirements for graduation were waived for FY20 and FY21 seniors (Emergency Order No. 2021-EO-02) who had yet to meet them. This fact should be kept in mind when examining longitudinal trends.

Summary of Results

In FY23, the District's overall graduation rate was 90.5%. In addition, the District's overall graduation rate exceeded Florida and the six other large urban school districts; however, Miami-Dade was second at 90.3%. When compared to FY22 and FY19 (the last year prior to COVID), graduation rates increased overall and for each subgroup.

From FY22 to FY23, the District graduation rate:

- Increased from 89.0% to 90.5% overall and from 92.8% to 94.1% for District-operated schools.
- Increased for Black students by 2.9, for Hispanic students by 1.9, for English Language Learners (ELL) by 6.8, for Free or Reduced-Price Lunch (FRL) students by 1.7, and for Students with Disabilities (SWD) by 2.5 percentage points.
- Remained stable for White students (increased < 1 percentage point).

During the five years from FY19 to FY23, the District graduation rate:

- Increased by 3.4 percentage points from 87.1% to 90.5%.
- Increased for Black (3.1 percentage points), Hispanic (3.5 percentage points), White (2.7 percentage points), and FRL (3.9 percentage points) students.
- Increased to a larger extent for ELL (7.4 percentage points) and SWD (6.2 percentage points) students.

The attached tables provide five-year (FY19-FY23) historical summaries. Table 1 reports the graduation rates for Florida, the District, and six other large urban school districts. Table 2 shows the graduation rates for Black,

Hispanic, White, ELL, FRL, and SWD students. Table 3 reports the graduation rates for District-operated and Charter schools. Tables 4 to 6 report graduation rates for District-operated high schools, Charter high schools, and Alternative high schools, respectively. Notably for District-operated schools:

- Twenty-one (87.5%) of the 24 District-operated high schools had graduation rates of 90% or higher.
- Six schools had graduation rates of 99% or higher: Alexander W. Dreyfoos, Olympic Heights, Spanish River, Suncoast, Village Academy (100%), and West Boca Raton High.
- Nine (37.5%) increased their graduation rates by 2 or more percentage points from FY22.
- Fifteen (62.5%) showed a positive 5-year change in excess of 1 percentage point. Village Academy showed the largest 5-year change with an 18.7 percentage point increase followed by Lake Worth Community High with a 9.0 percentage point increase.
- Of the District Alternative and ESE centers; Crossroads Academy, Riviera Beach Prep, Turning Points, Royal Palm School, and Palm Beach Virtual increased their graduation rates from FY19 to FY23.
- Palm Beach Virtual had a graduation rate of 100%.

Next Steps for Schools:

Using the Executive Summary and the Graduation Rate Analysis Tool² (anticipated availability by January 29, 2024), reflect on the following questions:

- 1. How does our overall rate compare to the prior year? The last five years? What trends do you see?
- 2. Are there differences between groups of students by race/ethnicity or gender?
- 3. Which of the "W" (withdrawal) codes had the greatest increase or decrease?
- 4. What percentage of students compared to the prior year are Non-graduates, Dropouts? Why?
- 5. Did the percentage of Graduates who met the assessment requirement with a concordant score increase or decrease? Which students? Why? How can we better support them?
- 6. Did the percentage of Non-graduates, who did not meet the credit or GPA requirement, increase or decrease? Why? Which students? How can we better support them?
- 7. What are we doing to monitor students beginning in the ninth grade and tracking them to graduation?

Appendix A: Federal Uniform Graduation Rate

Florida's Change to Reporting the Federal Graduation Rate

In October 2008, the U.S. Department of Education (USDOE) issued new directives for graduation rates. These new regulations require each state to calculate a four-year adjusted cohort rate, which follows students for four years after entering the ninth grade for the first time. The USDOE adopted this calculation method in an effort to streamline graduation rate calculations and establish uniform, accurate, and comparable rates across all states.

Starting with FY12, the school grade accountability system for the State of Florida changed from using the National Governors Association (NGA) rate to the Federal Graduation Rate. The Federal rate represents a higher standard than the NGA rate. Differences between the NGA rate and the Federal rate are described below.
